CVN Orthotics has recognized the need for enhanced foot support within a hockey skate. If a foot is pronating (rolling inward) the rigid skate boot will lock the foot in this pronated position, reinforcing this pronated position and the skater ends up fighting against him/herself. A quality custom foot orthotic requires 3 components:

REAR FOOT CONTROL - THROUGH A DEEP HEEL CUP

ARCH SUPPORT - CUSTOM CASTING WITH THE CORRECT CASTING METHOD

SEMI RIGID MATERIAL - THAT IS STRONG ENOUGH TO PREVENT OVERPRONATION
BUT FLEXIBLE ENOUGH TO ALLOW HEALTHY SHOCK ABSORPTION

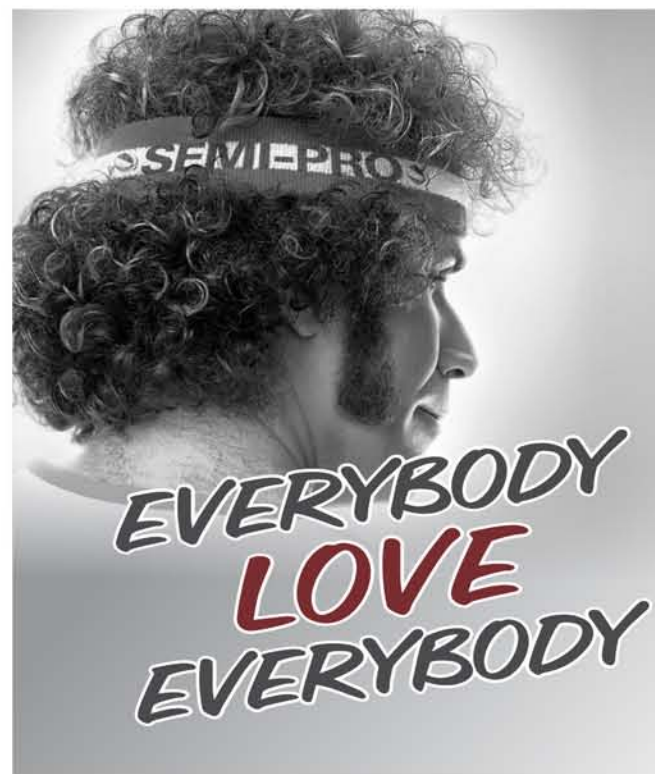


THE MUSCULOSKELETAL COMPONENT

Strong bones with strong healthy attachment points (joints) form the framework of the human body. It's the job of our muscles to move our bones and make our body do what we want it to. When the joints of our spine and extremities are misaligned, our muscles get pushed and pulled into abnormal positions. WHY MINOR AAA MIDGET?

The Nova Scotia Minor Midget League was created to improve the overall hockey product in our province. Within the current structure there are very few spots available for first year players within our Major Midget league. As such, many talented and skilled players are often overmatched and overlooked for players that are physically ready to play vs 3rd year players at that level.

Before the creation of the NSMMAAHL, these players were often left to go to our local high school league, a league outside of Hockey Canada's elite stream. Within Hockey Canada's elite stream, teams are guaranteed coaches with required certifications to run an elite program and players will be guaranteed the opportunity to develop to an elite level. The players also retain the best opportunity to be scouted by QMJHL and local MHL teams.

For the past 10 seasons, Nova Scotia has seen roughly 40 players selected into the QMJHL each year. In order to progress and increase this total, a change needed to be made to ensure our youngest midget players retain the competitive drive and practice habits to become elite players, challenge for spots in the Major Midget League and push each other to become better.

To put it honestly, many talented players are being overlooked and to make matters worse, being buried in a league that does not consistently develop players to be elite.

This previously overlooked talent will now be afforded the chance to flourish and develop well into the most

impactful years of life when all players are on the same playing field with regards to physical maturity.

The life opportunities afforded to players in elite sports is vast; Your hockey future is not just about the Q draft, it is about developing at the proper rate to be prepared for Jr league tryouts, athletic scholarships at home or abroad, and life opportunities away from the rink.

This league isn't just about creating a place to play, it is about taking our talent in this province to the next level and working toward a better life for yourself. We have already created the best player in the world and other NHL superstars, it is time to expand on that and secure consistency in our product on and off the ice.

The grit and toughness that created a legend named Mr. Hockey who spanned 5 decades over his career. The perseverance of Bobby Clarke to overcome diabetes and grow into one of the games most relentless checkers. The Intelligence of #4 Bobby Orr has he changed the way the game was played.

These hockey players were guided by their inherent character traits to become Legends. That is the key, over raw talent and natural athletic ability, these intangibles are paramount as we search for players to represent our team and dawn the jersey number of a legend.

Kings Hockey is proud to pay tribute to players that inspire us to be better within our lineup of sweater numbers.

As an ultimate tribute of legendary status, the following numbers have been retired by Kings Hockey and should never be worn throughout the hockey world again:

99 - "The Great One" Wayne Gretzky who possessed the skills, intelligence and most importantly, the ultimate drive and work ethic to be considered the greatest of all time

66 - "The Magnificent One" Mario Lemieux; perhaps the most talented and physically gifted player of all time got better with age and through adversity.

87 - "The Kid" Sidney Crosby dominates the modern game by a margin that rivals Gretzky and Lemieux of their times. Arguably the most complete player to ever play the game.

39 - "The Real Deal" Ryan Prosser was the ultimate teammate and leader through hard work, humor and humility. A gifted scorer and playmaker he had the intelligence to understand and take on any role to help his team win. A great player; an exceptional person.

2 COLE RENARD

One of the most complete defenders of any era, Port Hood's Al MacInnis will be forever remembered for his awesome slapshot. He played a very effective physical game and instead of rushing the puck he preferred to make crisp outlet passes. MacInnis led the Calgary Flames to a Stanley Cup championship in 1989 and capturing the Conne Smythe Trophy for his efforts, winning the scoring race and recording at least one point in the final 17 games, a playoff record for defensemen. He has won the Norris trophy and is one of only 4 Dmen to surpass 100pts in a season.

4 JARED FRASER

In an era of shut down defence, Orr revolutionized the sport with his scoring ability and playmaking from the blue line. He won two scoring titles, the only defender to accomplish that feat, and had career season highs of 46 goals and 102 assists. More than just statistics, Orr had the ability to control the game, to take over. For eight consecutive seasons Orr won the Norris Trophy as the best defenseman and three times he was the league's most valuable player to collect the Hart Trophy. Orr's plus-minus rating when he was at his best was untouchable at plus-124 in 1970-71, when he scored 139 points. Arguably the greatest of all time, Orr is the bridge between Howe's defensive era and Gretzky's offensive game.

Combined with his enormous talent, he appeared to play the game at the highest level almost effortlessly. Lidstrom was the ultimate low-maintenance, high-performance superstar. Not even blindly devotional fans of other teams could accuse him of whining to the officials or underhanded play. This calm, cool and collected superstar was in complete control every time he jumped over the boards.

His heartfelt interview defending his teammates and the Canadian game will be remembered as well as his offensive output during the "Pre-Gretzky Era".

Cam Neely is considered the pre-eminent power forward of his era. As a forechecker he was relentless and imposing, defencemen feared retrieving a puck when he was in pursuit. It was talent and tireless determination that set this competitor above his peers and earned Neely a spot in the Hockey Hall of Fame. His hands were silky soft when handling the puck but hard as a rock when handling an opponent. The qualities that made Cam Neely the player he was, grit, determination, toughness and unselfishness are immeasurable and set the tone of many hockey games for the Bruins.

A goal, an assist and a fight = a Gordie Howe hat trick, say no more about Mr. Hockey's approach to the game.

Clarke played a very aggressive game of hockey and was one of the best checkers in the entire history of the league. He was a ruffian, a warrior and a player who would do anything to help his teammates win. He had a famous, captivating smile - with about a dozen missing teeth and was instrumental in Canada's '72 victory over the Russians.

Wendel Clark was selected first overall by the Maple Leafs in 1985. Although never capturing a Cup title, playoff grit was clear after a 20 point playoff campaign and a memorable tilt with LA's Marty McSorley in '92. Clark's biggest accomplishment in his ten years was helping Canada's national team take the gold medal at the 1985 World Junior Hockey Championships.

At the time of his retirement, Burnaby Joe was eighth on the NHL's all-time scoring list. Although remembered for his quick release and accuracy, few will ever forget "the classiest Stanley Cup pass of all time" as instead of hoisting it, he handed it off to Ray Bourque in search of his first win in the twilight of his career. Joe's international achievements include Gold's with the World Jr's, World Championships, World Cup, & Olympics.

Perhaps the most prolific sniper in NHL history, He was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1991 and has had his number retired by the Islanders. Of equal significance, when Stastny and his brother Anton defected from their native Czechoslovakia in 1980 to play in the NHL, they unleashed a wave of Eastern European players that changed the face of the league. Stastny scored 450 NHL career goals—if one added the 120+ he scored playing club hockey in Czechoslovakia in his early 20s, he would easily be among the top ten scorers in NHL history. With 1,239 career points, he is the second-highest scorer among Europeans to play in the NHL.

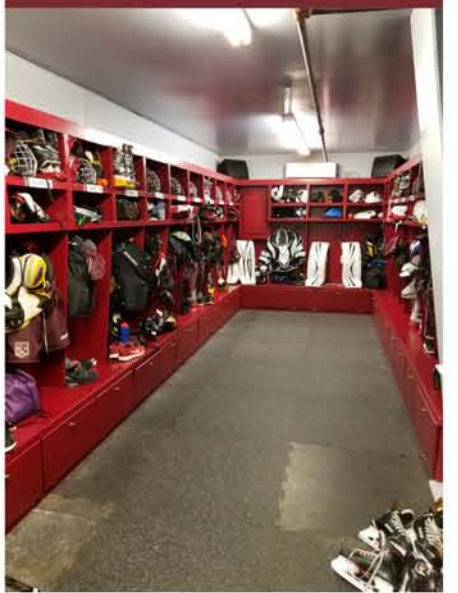
